Points of Reflection

- ☐ Reread the account about Peter's denial (John 13:36-38; 18:25-27; 21:1-14). Do you think Peter's fishing signifies lost hope? Explain.

- ☐ Fix your physical eyes on something. Think through how you did it.
 - Now, fix your mind on a thought (a bit more complicated).
 - Third, start by thinking of some problem you face and then deliberately turn your thoughts from the problem to God's coming grace (1 Peter 1:13).
 - How did it go? What is easy? What happened?

- ☐ Ask around, listen carefully, and analyze some ads. What are the hopes that drive the people around you?
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- ☐ Peter says that our faith and hope are in God (1 Peter 1:21). The strength of our hope depends upon its unchangeableness.
 - Read and explain the context of this verse (1 Peter 1:17-21).
 - Explain how our most fundamental faith and hope can be in God and never waver.
