1. What "Sound" Doctrine Is For

- In the pastoral letters, sound teaching is healthy teaching that accords with godliness and the Gospel.
- Its purpose is not merely to win disputes but to form healthy faith and life.

2. Two Outstanding Dangers

- One danger is false teaching that corrupts Gospel truth.
- Another is an unhealthy use of true teaching that becomes proud, speculative, or divisive.

3. The Theological Developmental Process

- Theological conclusions develop through observation, interpretation, comparison, reasoning, and organization.
- Recognizing this process helps us distinguish Scripture from the later structure we build from it.

4. The Examination Process

- Sound conclusions should be open to careful biblical examination rather than protected by reputation or tradition alone.
- Testing includes the clarity of biblical support, relationship to the Gospel, consistency, and spiritual fruit.

5. Healthy Doctrine Produces Healthy People

- The final test is not mere intellectual elegance. Sound doctrine should lead toward love, faith, holiness, and Christlike maturity.
